The FBMT program is an inter-professional faculty development initiative, which will create opportunities for teachers across the Health Sciences to use participatory strategies in the teaching of core educational principles within small groups. It will facilitate excellence in teaching and the development of inter-professional networks..

Program Goal

To build the interactive teaching skills of clinical teachers within the Health Sciences in an interprofessional environment.

Intended Audience

The FBMT program targets clinical teachers in Health Science programs across the province of BC.

Program Objectives


By the end of the program, the participants will be able to:

- 1) Deliver educational sessions using active learning strategies
- 2) Actively participate in interactive sessions on core educational topics
- 3) Provide effective and constructive feedback

Program Structure

A small group of 5 health professionals will participate in 6 sessions, every 2 months, for 1.5 hours. The group will be supported by a lead, who is experienced in facilitating participatory learning and in educational delivery.

The first session will be facilitated by the small group lead who will demonstrate examples of interactive teaching, focusing on the topic of feedback. Each member of the small group will have the opportunity to lead a subsequent session, and will practice using interactive strategies to deliver a topic of their choice from a selection of core educational topics.



Participants will be provided with a resource package to help them plan their teaching session. All participants will receive structured feedback from fellow participants at the end of their session. A certificate of completion of the FBMT program will be awarded upon completing all 6 small group sessions.
