Announcement: Developing Northern Research Collaborations

The <u>BC SUPPORT Unit, Northern Centre</u>, has dedicated funding to provide the opportunity for researchers, health care providers, decision makers, and patient partners to develop collaborations for person, family, and community centred research. The Developing Northern Research Collaboration Awards are expected to catalyze research that aligns with CIHR's <u>SPOR Capacity Development Framework</u> and the <u>SPOR Patient Engagement</u> <u>Framework</u>. The total amount available for this competition is \$50,000, enough to fund up to 5 awards. The maximum amount per award is \$10,000 per year for up to one year starting March 1, 2018.

New Regional Order Set: IV Antimicrobial Therapy for Outpatients and Home IV

The Antimicrobial Stewardship Program (AMS) committee has released a new regional order set: <u>IV Antimicrobial Therapy for Outpatients and Home IV</u>. This new order set is intended to be used by ambulatory and/or emergency departments. It contains information for guiding appropriate antibiotic selection, as well as information on appropriate patients and infections to treat in this setting. You will also find some tips for considering IV to PO conversion in your patients (see also the <u>IV to PO Conversion of Antimicrobials clinical practice standard</u>).

Infectious Disease Telemedicine Services in Northern BC

Dr. Abuobeida Hamour and Sophie Walton conducted a project aiming to understand patient perceptions of the infectious disease telemedicine service offered through Dr. Hamour's medical clinic in Prince George, BC. They collected their data through a patient satisfaction survey and also examined the uptake and demographics of patients, through a chart review, who have used the telemedicine service since its introduction in January 2013. Telehealth allows for the provision of a variety of healthcare services from a distance and improves access to services, especially for people living in rural and remote areas.
