- A small working group comprised of physicians and NH staff are meeting in June to develop implementation supports for the first 6 communities to implement the Regional Geriatric Specialized Services Model
- Representatives from all northern Divisions of Family Practice, First Nations Health Authority, Northern Health, specialists, UHNBC Physician Initiatives Committee, and UNBC are developing a Care in the Community Shared Care Proposal, focusing on alternative levels of care and challenges that occur across the north in terms of supports for seniors

- The Perinatal Program Council re-launched in March 9, 2018 and is refreshing the • priorities and goals for the program as well as seeking patient partners to join the Council
- Preliminary Council priorities include supporting normal physiological birth, support-0 ing the Baby Friendly Initiative (BFI) 10 steps, perinatal depression screening and perinatal education
- The MOREOB Plus education platform re-launched at the end of January 2018 with • site core teams setting their "Game Plans" for local quality improvement and patient safety initiatives. Several MOREOB workshops and activities have been implemented in sites across the region over the last few months
- Perinatal Services BC (PSBC) Perinatal Tiers of Service Self-Assessment reports • have been distributed from Perinatal Services BC to inform service planning and networking. Ongoing work with sites is occurring to clarify and validate the information and designations
- Ongoing work between the Perinatal Program, Surgical Program and Medical Directors to plan and support the Rural Surgical and Obstetrical Networks (RSON) across the north

- Sheila Gordon-Payne and Cathy Czechmeister provide regional leadership for professional practice of nurses, and Susanne Watson for allied health professions. The team provides consultation services to advise and support leaders/ managers and staff about the professional scope and practice of health care professionals on an ongoing basis
- Professional Practice supports scope of practice adjustments when required; current work includes the initial management of anaphylaxis by nurses and advances in the role of nurses in the management of wounds
- The team is currently involved in ensuring nursing standards are shared and met regarding medicinal cannabis and the legalization of recreational cannabis
- NH has partnered with the provincial CAYA (Communication Assistance for Youth and Adults) program to build a Speech Language Pathologist (SLP) and SLP assistant team to provide regional therapeutic support and augmentative/ alternative communication technologies (AACs) to individuals with severe communication disabilities due to diagnoses such as.
