





Haloperidol Oral Tablets

<u>The issue:</u> haloperidol 0.5 mg, 1 mg, 2 mg, 5 mg and 10 mg oral tablets are on backorder from the only manufacturer in Canada (Teva). NH has a good supply of haloperidol 1 mg tablets, but stock levels of all other strengths may not meet future demands. Inventory of some strengths might be depleted prior to the resolution of this backorder.

<u>Clinical Use:</u> first generation antipsychotic typically used for agitation/aggression and for nausea/vomiting

Estimated Resolution: November 2022 for the 1mg tablets; March 2023 for all other strengths

Practice Implications:

• Clinicians should be aware of this drug shortage and potential formulary alternatives.

Potential Formulary Alternatives*:

- Agitation/aggression:
 - haloperidol injectable
 - o loxapine oral tablets and injectable
 - o lorazepam sublingual tablets and injectable (injectable also on shortage)
 - o quetiapine oral tablets
 - o olanzapine oral tablets and injectable (injectable also on shortage)
- Nausea/Vomiting:
 - o dimenhydrinate oral tablets and injectable
 - o metoclopramide oral tablets and injectable
 - o ondansetron oral tablets and injectable
