





Lorazepam 4 mg/mLX 1 mL Vials

The Issue: Due to the shortage of Canadian-labelled lorazepam 4 mg/mL X 1 mL vials from Sandoz, Health Canada has authorized the importation of a US-labelled product from <u>Hikma</u>. NH pharmacy may need to bring in supply of this US-labelled product available if the resolution date gets extended past November.

Practice Implications:

- Clinicians should be aware of this (potential) temporary product change.
- Staff may see both the Canadian-labelled and US-labelled products in circulation.
- The concentration, vial size, preservative content (benzyl alcohol), and latex-free status are the same between the Canadian-labelled and US-labelled products.
- PRODUCT DIFFERENCES:
 - The US-labelled product does not have a Drug Identification Number (DIN) on the vial and does not contain any information in French.
 - The US-labelled product is for <u>single-use only</u>, and must be <u>stored only in the fridge</u> (no stability data is available for storage at room temperature).
 - The NH Parenteral Drug Administration Manual monograph has been updated on OurNH.
 - The US-labelled product can be used in the same manner as the Canadian marketed product. Clinicians should refer to the <u>Canadian Product Monograph</u> available from Health Canada.
