





Formulary Restriction Reminder Ondansetron Oral Disintegrating Tablets

Issue:

Ondansetron 4 mg and 8 mg oral disintegrating tablets (ODT) are <u>formulary restricted</u> in BC for use in *patients who are unable to tolerate other available dosage forms (regular oral tablets, oral liquid, and injection).* It has been identified that use of ondansetron ODTs in NH facilities is high compared to some other areas of the province.

Rationale for Provincial Restriction Criteria:

- ondansetron ODTs <u>do not</u> offer an absorption advantage over regular oral tablets as they also require GI absorption (not absorbed via oral mucosa, must still be swallowed)
- ondansetron ODTs are significantly more expensive than the other dosage forms
 - approximately 20 times the cost of the regular oral tablets and 3 times the cost of the injectable

Implications:

- Clinicians should be aware of the BC formulary restriction for ondansetron ODTs and reserve use for patients who meet criteria.
- Wardstock quantities should be minimal and limited to clinical areas where eligible patients may be located.
 - NH pharmacies should review wardstock quantities and locations with clinical leads in their facility, and remove or adjust as appropriate.
- Pharmacists should review orders for ondansetron ODTs to ensure patients meet restriction criteria for dispensing.
