











BC Health Authorities Provincial Drug Shortage Memo

Drug:

Salbutamol nebules (all formats) - 2.5 mg/2.5mL and 5 mg/2.5mL

Classification:

β2-agonist bronchodilator

Indication:

Treatment of bronchospasm

Duration:

Salbutamol 2.5 mg/2.5 mL nebules are on backorder from Pharmascience until late February 2025 and from Teva with no known resolution date. Salbutamol 5 mg/2.5 mL nebules are available on very limited supply until mid-January 2025. Supply of this format will not able to cover the shortage of the other formats. NH pharmacy currently has approximately 4-5 weeks supply of 2.5 mg/2.5 mL nebules and several months supply of 5 mg/2.5 mL nebules remaining based on historic usage.

Practice Implications:

Salbutamol metered dose inhalers (MDI) continue to be available. Due to the prolonged duration of this shortage, please reserve and prioritize salbutamol nebules exclusively for:

- Pediatric patients who cannot use the MDI.
- Adult patients with status asthmaticus that require continuous salbutamol treatment.
- Patients recently extubated but demonstrating poor inspiratory effort and unable to use MDI + spacer.

Unless salbutamol MDIs are used in place of nebules wherever possible, supplies of the nebules will run out. Please refer to table below for nebule to MDI dosage conversion for adult dosing (<u>refer to pediatric resources for pediatric dosing guidelines</u>).

salbutamol nebule dosage	recommended salbutamol 100mcg/dose MDI conversion (adult)
salbutamol 2.5 mg/2.5mL (2.5 mg)	2 puffs
salbutamol 5 mg/2.5mL (5 mg)	4 puffs

Available Alternatives*:

- Salbutamol 100 mcg metered dose inhaler
- Salbutamol 5 mg/mL X 10 mL inhaled solution (not available at all sites; contact pharmacy as needed)
