- Medical Certification of Death - Vital Statistics Agency: a medical or nurse practitioner must complete the Medical Certification of Death within 48 hours of death in compliance with Section 18 of the Vital Statistics Act and provide the completed form to the funeral director so that a Disposition Permit may be issued.
